2023 Summer Reading Report

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Intro

Our mission is to help educators and librarians encourage reading in their communities. In today's climate, we believe supporting you—school and public librarians—is more important than ever. Collectively, your efforts led readers to log over 1 billion minutes last summer! That's a new record for us!

Building a vibrant reading culture is a collective effort, and we're grateful we get to do it with the best of the best. Through our partnerships with schools and public libraries, we have witnessed positive summer reading outcomes year after year. This annual report shares what we've learned through data analysis and your insights. So Much Summer Reading

Summer 2023 proved our most successful yet, with the participation of more than 1,800 public libraries and 200 school districts. In total, librarians and educators created 21,399 reading challenges. And together, millions of readers logged over a billion minutes.

Summer Reading Sentiments

At the end of every summer reading season, we survey our partners to learn more about how summer reading went from their perspective. The results? Approximately 60% of our partners reported increased participation between summer 2022 and summer 2023, while almost 90% of polled libraries agreed that they reached their goals for summer 2023 with help from Beanstack.



Reading Challenge Design Trends & Recommendations

Running a reading challenge doesn't have to be hard. Beanstack provides themed templates you can choose from, or you can opt to design your own. Once you choose your theme, Beanstack allows you to set and track goals, including total minutes or total books read per participant.

Our data shows that providing a variety of badges for readers to earn leads to increased participation. For example, challenges offering 10 or more badges saw an average of 70.50% active participation, while those offering fewer than 10 badges saw an average of 63.05% participation.



Including a reading log type in your challenge also boosts participation. Activity-only challenges average a 51% participation rate, while all other log types had a higher participation rate of 65%.

When it comes to different types of logs, it depends on the reader's age. Minutes are the most popular and widely used, offering a more balanced approach. This method creates fairness between struggling and advanced readers and accommodates busy adults. Additionally, it provides educators and librarians with valuable insights into students' reading habits. For young readers whose parents often read multiple short picture books to them daily, logging books may be the more suitable method.

Make Reading Social

Harness the power of community to boost reading engagement. Whether setting a community-wide reading target or fostering connections among readers, building social components into summer reading programs clearly makes a positive impact. Data indicates that readers with friends logged 87.19% more minutes during the summer of 2023. These readers also engage more deeply with reading programs. A recent analysis of school reading challenges found that students completed 55.27% more reviews and 49.11% more activities when schools activated friends and leaderboards. Across the nation, summer reading programs are key touchstones used to connect with readers of all ages and invest in students' development.

Boost Activity Participation With Bingo

Beanstack's bingo challenges allow librarians to create game boards and award badges for earning bingo and filling cards. With various pathways to completion available to participants, readers can choose the set of badges they work toward earning.

Incentives Work

Don't underestimate the power of incentives! Over the past year, across all challenges, we found that engagement increases when challenges offer rewards. In a recent Beanstack school analysis, reading challenges with rewards averaged **101.67% more active participation** than challenges without.

During the summer of 2023, offering one or two rewards boosted participation in public library reading challenges by 12.70%, while offering three or more rewards boosted participation by 26.61%.

Schools and libraries are coming up with innovative ways to provide rewards. Many offer smaller prizes throughout the challenge, such as gift cards, book drawings, and the opportunity to earn raffle tickets. To celebrate the conclusion of their program, one library recognized winners with a pancake breakfast. At the same time, the students at an elementary school earned a PTA-sponsored roller skating night with the principal. While rewards can come in many forms, not all rewards have to be tangible.

"We hold a summer reading breakfast for students who read 360 minutes or more. Students learn the gift of giving, too! Students who read 720 minutes select a book to gift to a child in foster care. We will keep the challenges going throughout the year. My goal is for our students to give at least 100 books this year to foster children in our community."

Collaborate Using Tandems

Tandems make it easy for communities to unite to promote a strong reading culture. This allows local public libraries and schools to connect their Beanstack sites, making it easy for readers to link their accounts and simultaneously participate in library and school reading challenges.

Our data shows that tandems also boost engagement. As a matter of fact, library sites with tandems average 203.47% more total minutes logged, 127.46% more total days, and 167.98% more books read.
