Add these to your library queue and mark them off as you read!

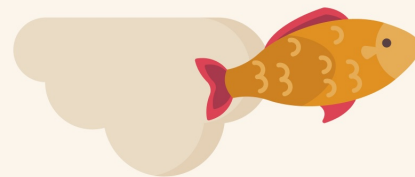
